

Bobelaine Audubon Sanctuary Conditions of Use

Bobelaine Audubon Sanctuary is open to birders, naturalists, photographers, students, artists and those interested in wildlife and nature. There is no entrance fee. It is open from sunrise to sunset, 7 days a week. You do not need to be an Audubon member to visit the sanctuary. Access is by walking trails only. Please stay on the trails for your own safety and to protect the sanctuary.

There are many dead or dying trees (snags) in the sanctuary that can and do fall across trails. These snags may drop with little or no provocation. Please stay alert, especially on windy or rainy days, as snags often fall under these conditions.

- No smoking within the sanctuary, trails or in the parking area.
- No pets of any kind are allowed in the sanctuary.
- No camping on sanctuary property including the parking and barn area.
- No auto tour access into the sanctuary.
- No picnics or party-type activities within the sanctuary.
- No alcoholic beverages of any kind are allowed on sanctuary property.
- No glass bottles allowed in the sanctuary.
- No model airplane or drones are to be flown in the sanctuary.
- No shooting, hunting or fishing are allowed in the sanctuary.
- No bicycles or wheeled vehicles of any kind are allowed in the sanctuary except for sanctuary maintenance vehicles.
- No studies or release of any animals of any kind will be conducted without sanctuary management approval (see below for contact information).

Bobelaine Sanctuary is not wheelchair accessible.

Groups of ten or more people are asked to contact the manager ahead of time to ensure your visit does not conflict with major trail mowing or other sanctuary maintenance. Contact **sacaudubonpresident@gmail.com**

Help us keep our sanctuary clean. Pack all trash out. There is no regular trash pick up. This applies to all sanctuary property, inside and outside the levee.

As a State Ecological Reserve, all flowers, berries, fungi, plants and wildlife are protected and must not to be picked or otherwise removed from the sanctuary.
